#### Uniform

We expect all students to be in correct uniform. Please look in your child's planner or on the website for full details. If unsure about any issue with uniform please contact the school. Uniform can be purchased at Morleys in Chilwell and Simply First in Stapleford

#### Catering

The school now operates a cashless catering system called sQuid. Students have to look after a card which is topped up by parents online. All students in Year 7 will receive details of how to open their accounts in the middle of August. We recommend that parents put on £2.50 a day for lunches.

There are various options available; snacks, school dinner, vegetarian options and healthy options. Sandwiches can be eaten in the Dining Room or Garden Area. Snacks also available at break.

## Lockers

Lockers are available for students on a first come first served basis. Students will need to provide their own padlock.

## Issues with bullying

We take this issue seriously. Incidents are investigated and sanctions can lead to exclusion, but also detentions, internal exclusions and working together with parents.

Do not agree to keep bullying a secret – let us know. Students must let their Learning Manager know of any issues or can let us know using our anti bullying e-mail address and mobile phone number. These can be found in the student planner.

## **Transport**

A bike pass is required for students who wish to cycle to school. These are available in September if your child lives more than a mile away from school. A helmet is required for all cycle users. We expect students to cycle to school safely and any student who does not will have their pass removed.

Please do not drop or pick your child up at the school gates as there is not enough room and they become congested with students at the start and end of school. Please use the Park in the Park and Ride.

## **Upper and Lower Site**

The Stapleford side of the school is referred to as Upper site and the Toton side of the school is referred to as Lower site

### **Attendance**

If your child is unable to attend school through illness/medical appointment please contact the school reception as soon as possible after 8am on that day, giving the reason for your child's absence. You will need to contact the school each day of your child's absence.

If you do not contact reception you will receive a text message from the school asking you to contact reception to explain the absence. Should you fail to contact school a letter will be sent home with the date of the absence and again asking you to contact school to give a reason for your child's non-attendance to school. Once we have followed this procedure and there has still no contact from home the absence will go down on your child's records as an unauthorized absence. Any attendance concerns that we have will be passed on to the Educational Welfare Officer who will investigate further.

Please ensure that we are up to date with current mobile phone numbers. The school will not authorise term time holidays and this will automatically go down as an unauthorised absence on your child's records.

### **Punctuality**

All students are expected to be at school at 8.45am. Members of the staff stand at Upper and Lower Site Gate to record anyone who is late.

If a child is late three times they receive a Friday night detention for one hour.

On the rare occasion you are stuck in traffic, phone reception to let us know and your child won't be recorded as late.

#### **Free School Meals**

Each year the school receives funding for students who are registered to receive Free School Meals. This money helps to ensure that all students receive equal opportunities throughout their time at school. Students registered for free school meals receive a uniform voucher, paid for curriculum trips and equipment essential for their studies. # How do I know how my child is doing?

Three times a year you will receive an assessment point which contains information on the progress your child is making as well information on their effort, behaviour and meeting deadlines. The first assessment point of the year is posted to you and an example of what a scan looks like is on the next page.

During the year as well there are a number of key information evenings for you to attend. You will receive reminders for these in the monthly e-mail bulletins.

In Year 9, 10 and 11 each child also receives a written report. If you have any concerns about the progress of your child or any questions remember to contact school.
